GARDEN VIEWS

Although this Manhattan-based outdoor entertaining space may comparatively lack in square footage, it exceeds many as both a functional and trendy home addition. "When you have a small terrace like this, you have to select plants and trees that won't block the views, yet are tall enough so you still feel like you're in a secluded garden environment," says Philip Roche, co-owner of New York-based Plant Specialists, who designed the space with business partner Grahame Hubbard and interior designer Douglas Durkin. Roche adds that it's generally best to choose plantings that are relatively low maintenance for city-based terraces, such as the tall hornbeams, lavender and boxwood used in this space.
